We hope and pray that the drop-in is a place of welcome and home. We think of Jesus, sitting down to eat a meal with folks suffering and forgotten, bringing healing and love. At times overwhelmed and unsure of how to keep going, we are inspired by the hope, courage and resilient creativity of our young friends. We look to Love and Mercy to find a way for us all.

The Sunday Suppers continues to be a place to feast together--guests and volunteers forming a unique community of sharing and care. We especially thank the youth from Fall River who volunteer so faithfully at Sunday Supper. Thanks for supporting ARK in presence and prayer each week. Our concerns for prayer and support:

- **-We are concerned about our monthly \$ needs.** ARK is funded solely by donations from individuals, churches and community groups. The monthly budget for ARK (both the drop-in and Sunday Suppers) is \$10,000. Currently, we are certain of half this amount. A number of our long-term supporters have passed away in recent years.
